At Hi Lonesome Prairie:

Hi Lonesome Prairie Tours hourly from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Shuttle departs from corner of Butterfield and Maple Streets in Cole Camp (Cole Camp is approximately 20 miles south of Sedalia.)

To reach Dr. Morton's prairie from Cole Camp, take Hwy. 52 west and go 0.75 mile. Turn north on Klink Road (gravel) at the propane distributor. Go 1.5 miles and turn west on Hi Lonesome Road. Go 0.5 mile to a gate on the south side of the road. Watch for signs and the big tent.
